



Camping and cabins

Fees

Camping and accommodation fees are in addition to national park entry fees where applicable. Fees apply only to the camping area or accommodation for which they are paid and are not transferable to other camping areas or accommodation. Your fees are used to manage and improve facilities and services.

Dogs

Please remember that dogs are not allowed in national parks and most reserves.

Rubbish

Rubbish bins are not provided in parks and reserves. You are required to take all rubbish away with you. Remember to take some bags suitable for rubbish when you pack. for your trip.

Arthur-Pieman Conservation Area (APCA)

Note that this is a conservation area - national park entry fees do not apply

Self Registration Camping fees apply in some camping areas please contact : Parks and Wildlife Service - Arthur Pieman (03) 6457 1225

Conditions:

- A site is an area not exceeding 10 metres by 8 metres.
- Fees apply to entire APCA per site. Short-stay bookings are not taken. There are no powered sites in the Arthur-Pieman Conservation Area.

There are three campgrounds at Arthur River with water and toilet facilities. Wood is not supplied but fallen wood may be collected from beaches. Caravan access is available.

A small campground is situated at the Pieman State Reserve at Corinna, with water and pit toilet, and operated by a private operator. Ph: (03) 6446 1170. Dogs are not allowed

Ben Lomond National Park

National park entry fees apply

No camping charge. No bookings are taken. A small campground with six un-powered sites is situated 1 km inside the park boundary and approximately 7 kms from the summit of the mountain, suitable for tents or small campervans. There is a flush toilet, non-treated water, picnic table and lookout. Note: National Parks Passes can be purchased at the Creek Inn, on Ben Lomond, where meals & other accommodation options are available year round. Bookings: Ph: (03) 6390 6199.

Cockle Creek (Southwest National Park)

National park entry fees apply

No camping fees or bookings taken. Several camping grounds with pit toilets (no water or firewood) are located at Recherche Bay Nature Recreation Area before the Cockle Creek bridge. Access to tank water (not treated) from the park is permitted.

Once over the Cockle Creek bridge, national park entry fees and conditions apply. Dogs, generators and fires are not permitted inside the national park (after the bridge) section of Cockle Creek, but are permitted in the Recherche Bay Nature Recreation Area. Small campsites, plus the larger one at Boltions Green have a pit toilet. It is advisable to carry own drinking water.

National park passes available from Service Tasmania, Huonville Parks Office (22 Main St, Huonville), Forest Design Centre, Geeveston or Hastings Caves Visitor Centre.

24 hour passes available from self-registration booth at Cockle Creek. Road to Cockle Creek is often rough in places. Caravan access is possible with care.

Cradle Mountain

The cabins are located 5km inside the park. Bookings are necessary. Each cabin is equipped with heating (gas, electric or wood), single bunk beds, basic cooking utensils, crockery, cutlery, a standard stove/oven, electric lighting, and a small refrigerator. Amenities blocks are located near the cabins and are equipped with showers and toilets. Linen can be provided at an additional charge

Note: The campground just before the Cradle Mountain National Park entrance, is privately operated by Discovery Holiday parks. Campsites, cabins, bunk rooms, powered sites and alpine mini huts are available, phone (03) 6492 1395 for charges/bookings.

Douglas-Apsley National Park

National park entry fees apply

No camping fees or bookings taken. There is a small bush camping area near Apsley Waterhole and viewing platform, 10 minutes walk from carpark off Rosedale Road. Pit toilet, shelter, small information booth, water from river only. Fuel stoves only from 1 October to 30 April each year.

Franklin-Gordon Wild Rivers National Park

National park entry fees apply

No camping fees or bookings taken.

The main visitor facilities are at Franklin River. This day use area includes information and interpretation panels, picnic tables, and toilets with disabled access. There are also picnic tables at Bird River.

Camping is permitted at Kelly Basin, which is a 2 hour walk from the road end. This park is a fuel stove only area.

Freycinet National Park

Note: Due to the high demand for campsites, a ballot system operates for the Christmas holiday period. Entries by fax/letter/e-mail drawn on 1st August Enter early to avoid disappointment. Campground bookings will only be taken from 18th December until the March long weekend and again at Easter each year. At other times of the year it is advisable to telephone the visitor centre and book a site. Contact Frey cinet National Park for details.

Camping available at Richardsons Beach (dunes area - fuel stoves only), Honeymoon Bay (open Summer/Easter only), and Ranger Creek. Electric barbecues, picnic tables, untreated water and toilets at Honeymoon Bay and Ranger Creek. Toilet at Wineglass Bay car park. For caravans, 19 powered sites are available. A designated backpackers camping area (no cars/no bookings taken/groups must register with Visitor Centre) is available. Caravan access is available only to powered sites.

A basic campground is also available at Friendly Beaches (Isaacs Point). The turn-off is approximately 19 kms before the Coles Bay township and main park entrance. Pit toilets, no water, fuel stove only area. National park fees apply, but there is no camping charge.

Lake Pedder (South West National Park via Maydena)

Self registration camping fees apply to Teds Beach and Huon Campgrounds..

Teds Beach Campground: On sealed Gordon River Road near Strathgordon. Boat ramp, toilets, non-treated drinking water, picnic facilities, free electric barbecues, shelters, fuel stove only. Caravan access is available.

Edgar Campground: On unsealed road, just off Scotts Peak Road. Boat ramp, non-treated drinking water, toilets, no showers, picnic facilities, shelters, fireplace with wood supplied. Caravan access is available.

Huon Campground: On unsealed road, just off Scotts Peak Road. Non-treated drinking water, toilets, picnic facilities, shelters, fireplace with wood supplied. Caravan access is available.

Maria Island National Park

Penitentiary accommodation consists of nine 6-bunk-bed rooms, each with vinyl-covered mattresses, picnic-style table & chairs and wood heater (not suitable for cooking).

A tenth room sleeps 6 and 8 in separate areas and is charged as two rooms. Bring food, bedding, lighting and cooking gear including stove.

Toilet facilities, basic laundry/scullery room, hot showers (\$1 coins required). Firewood provided. Fireplaces in camping area. Free gas barbecues in shelter behind dunes of Darlington Bay beach.

Two free campsites are available at French's Farm and Encampment Cove, 3-4 hours walk away. Fuel stoves only at French's Farm. Non-treated rainwater available from tanks

Mt Field National Park

National park entry fees apply

Mt Field Campground: un-powered and powered sites, and amenities block, are operated by Tasmania Parks and Wildlife Service. Phone (03) 6288 1149 for information on fees and facilities.

Government Huts

Accommodation fees and bookings: Parks and Wildlife Service Mt Field (03) 6288 1149

Three cabins with 6 bunks per cabin, with vinyl covered mattresses, cold water, wood heater and firewood. No electricity/gas. Communal toilet block (no showers). Fuel stove essential, no fires outside cabins.

A deposit is required to secure your booking. Deposits by cheque/credit card forwarded at least 7 days prior to Parks and Wildlife Service Mt Field Keys can be collected from and must be returned to the Mt Field Visitor Centre during business hours. A key deposit is required.

Mt William National Park

National park entry fees apply

Camping fees apply no bookings are taken

There are 6 designated camping sites: Top Camp near Musselroe Bay; Deep Creek near Eddystone Point; Stumpys Bay No.1; Stumpys Bay No.2; Stumpys Bay No.3; and Stumpys Bay No.4. Generators are only permitted at, Stumpys BayNo.3.

Bore water, for washing purposes only, available at Stumpys campground Nos. 1 and 3, and also at Deep Creek campsite. Caravan access is available

No drinking water available at this park. Please bring your own drinking water and own firewood (available for sale in the Gladstone Township). Fuel stoves are recommended in this park.

Some picnic tables and fireplaces provided, pit toilets at all sites. Day shelter with gas barbecues at adjacent to Stumpys Bay No. 4 only with a small non-treated water tank (seasonal only).

Narawntapu National Park

National park entry fees apply

Camping fees apply

No bookings are taken. Campgrounds at Springlawn, the Horse yards, Bakers Point and Griffiths Point. Self-registration system for campers operates from the Springlawn Visitors Centre. Except for large school groups, bookings are not taken. Most campsites have tables and pit toilets. Fuel stoves advisable.

At Springlawn there are septic toilets, a shower block (Fee for 4 minute tokens, available from Visitor Centre), powered sites and electric barbecues.

Badger Head is a day-use only area, has picnic facilities (barbecue, tables, shelter) but no toilet.

Peggs Beach Conservation Area

This is a conservation area – national park entry fees do not apply.

Self registration camping fees apply.

Peggs Beach Conservation Area has two designated camping areas. Black River campground – pit toilets, no drinking water; Peggs Beach campground – flushing toilets, no drinking water.

South Bruny National Park

National park entry fees apply, except for the Neck Reserve.

Self registration camping fees apply to Cloudy bay, Jetty beach and The Neck campgrounds

No bookings taken.

Cloudy Bay/Jetty Beach

The Pines on Cloudy Bay Road, very small, pit toilet.

Jetty Beach - Cape Bruny. Two pit toilets, non-treated tank water (seasonal only), picnic shelters, no firewood, safe swimming for children. Boat launch from beach. Caravan access is available

The Neck Reserve

The Neck Reserve is outside the national park – no park entry fees apply.

Pit toilet, day use shelter, open fireplace, no wood supplied, non-treated tank water (seasonal only). Caravan access is available.

Tasman National Park

National park entry fees apply, except for Lime Bay

Self registration camping fees apply at Fortescue Bay and Lime Bay

Bookings are necessary. Toilet, cold shower, fireplaces, wood available for sale. Gas barbecue in day use area. National parks passes available from caretaker, 24 hour park passes available at self-registration box near campground information board. Caravan access is available.

Basic campsites, pit toilets, no water, fires permitted, no firewood supplied. Fuel stoves recommended. Caravan access is available.
